

As a University, we are honoured to host you during this important event in our scholarly calendar. Knowledge dissemination and transfer of research outputs is a key strategic objective of the university, together with increase of registerable innovations; consultancy and public policy analysis, and to engage in priority areas of community outreach and extension.

The theme of this conference “**Research and Innovations for Resilience in a Changing Environment**” encapsulates the strategic objectives and clearly interprets the covid era in which researchers and innovators must refocus, rethink and re-organize how to conduct their business.
